4. Would a member of the <u>U.S. political party active from 1834 to 1854</u> wear a <u>head covering made of artificial hair?</u>	Whig / Wig We're guessing yes.
5. The Oscar Wilde comedy about the importance of being genuine features two characters claiming to have the first name of the Nobel Prize-winning Hemingway.	Earnest / Ernest
